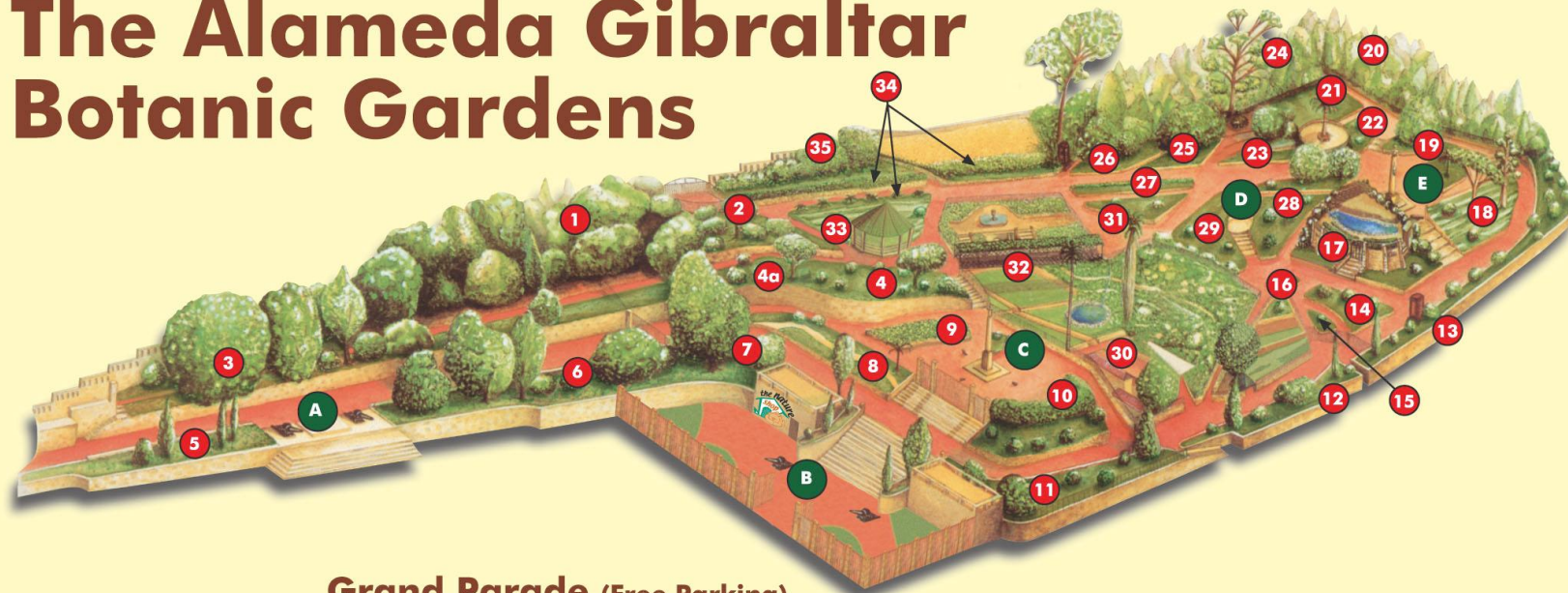


# The Alameda Gibraltar Botanic Gardens

The Wellington Monument with two 13 inch mortars and a bronze 12 pounder gun.

Specimen trees - local and introduced.

**2**  
Mediterranean Area.

**3**  
Specimen trees - local and introduced.

**4 4a**  
Succulents of Africa particularly Aloes and Euphorbias.

**5 6 7**  
Specimen trees and bushes - local and introduced.

**8**  
"Meeting of two Continents", displaying a wide variety of succulents including true cacti.

**9**  
Moroccan Dragon trees and *Aloe arborescens* from S.Africa.

**10**  
A 300 year old Dragon tree. Also shrubs and Cycads.

**11 12 13**  
Specimen trees and shrubs - local and introduced.

**14**  
Palm collection, also Eucalyptus and a very large *Yucca elephantipes* from Mexico, plus in autumn a fine display of Belladonna Lilies.

**15**  
Moroccan Dragon trees.

**16**  
Sonoran Desert area, including *Yucca torreyi*, Smoke Tree *Brahea armata* with its powder blue leaves and various cacti.

**17**  
"The Alameda Open-air Theatre". Toilets near telephone box.

**18**  
Our oldest Moroccan Dragon Tree - *Dracaena draco* subsp. *aigal* and *Phoenix canariensis*. With a variety of plants from the Atlantic islands - particularly the Canary Islands, Cape Verde Islands and Madeira.

**19**  
This display includes *Bismarkia* palm from Madagascar, plus Sedums, Pelargoniums etc...

**20**  
Wild Gibraltar Woodland, although by the path there are large clumps of the prickly Pear Cactus (*Opuntia ficus-indica*).

**21**  
Old cemetery area.

**22**  
Sundry trees and shrubs, mainly native.

**23**  
"Lions' Pond", where in addition to various trees, there are a range of plants that would be considered as house plants in N. Europe.

**24**  
The Animal Conservation Park.

**25 26**  
"Australian Beds" which contain mostly trees and shrubs of Australia.

**27 28**  
"South African Beds" with sundry trees and shrubs, mostly from southern Africa.

**29**  
A range of species Pelargoniums.

**30**  
Reference library and Exhibition and Toilets.

**31**  
Sundry trees and Shrubs.

**32**  
"The Italian Gardens" in the Dell, containing a wide range of plants, including some very rare Hibiscus, Tree Ferns, two large *Washingtonia* palms from California, the Gibraltar Castle and Key and water features.

**33**  
A large display of Aloes originating from the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew. These plants arrived in June 2002.

**34**  
"Family Beds", depicting a range of plants from particular families, one of which is devoted mainly to the family: Malvaceae - the very colourful Hibiscus family

**35**  
Sundry trees and shrubs including some from California.
